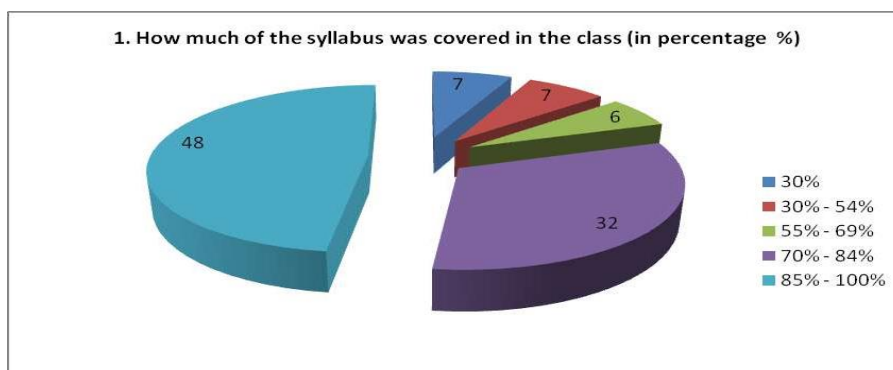


**Report of Student Satisfaction Survey on Teaching Learning Process

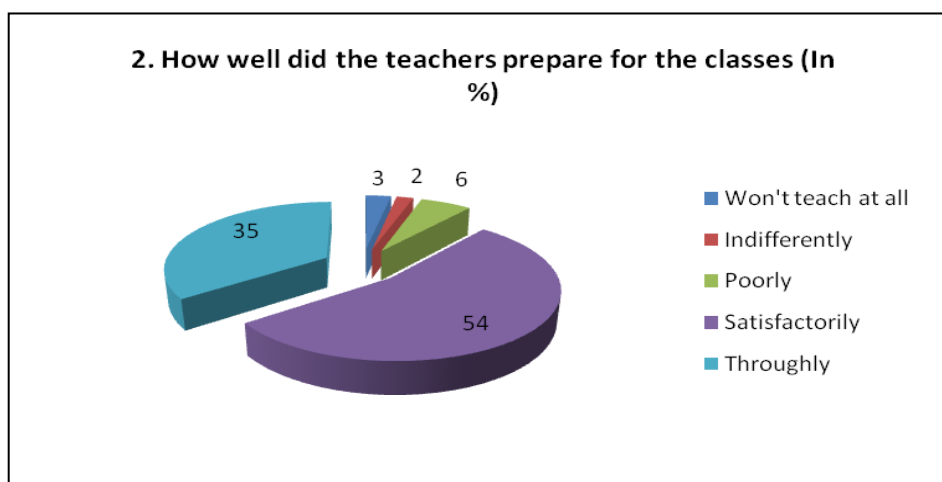
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

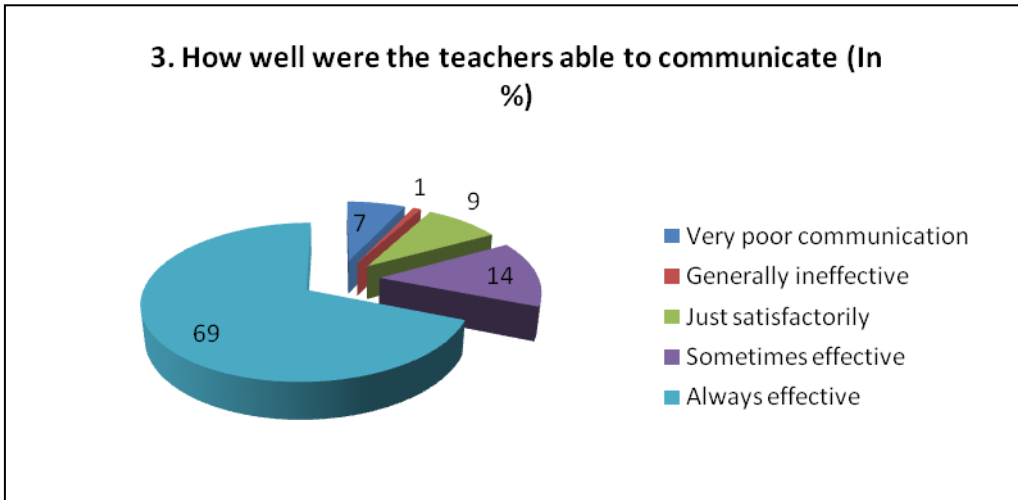

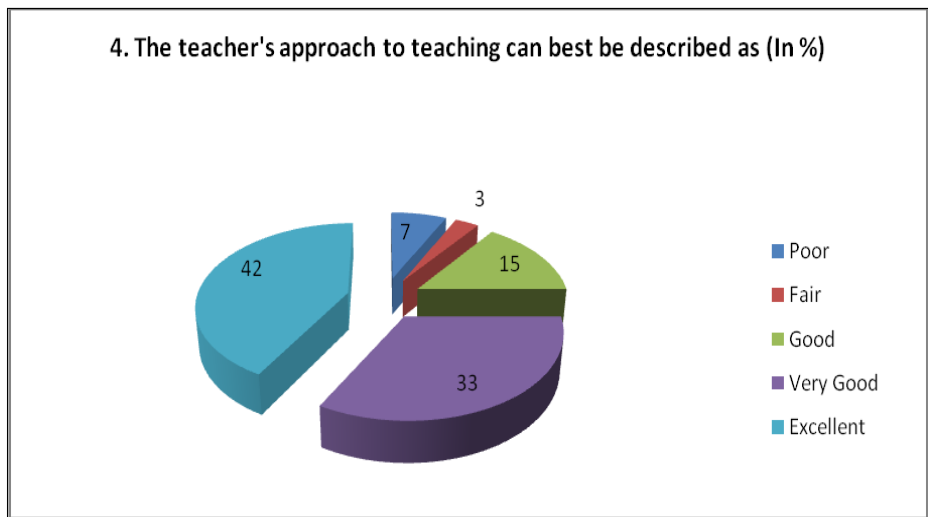

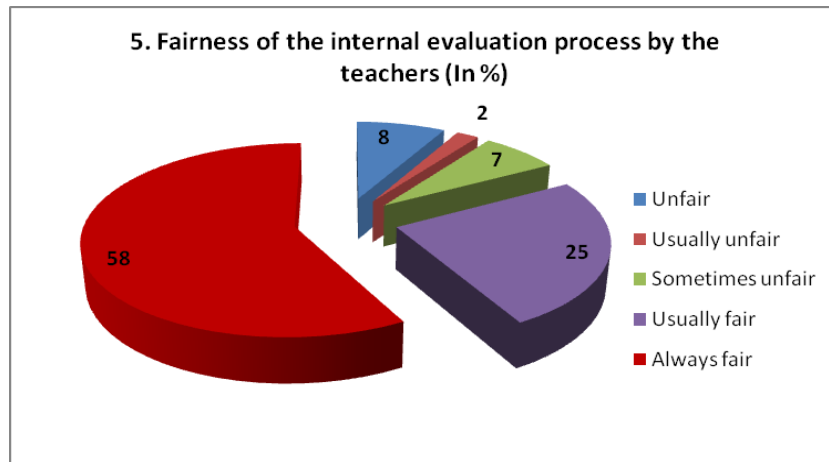
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

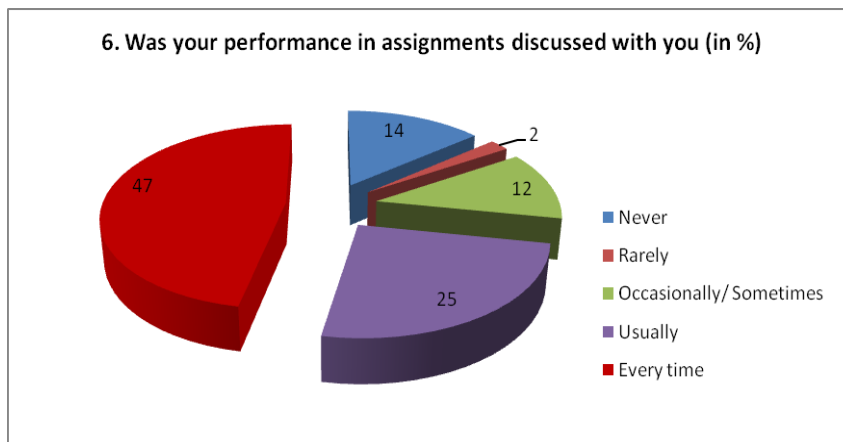

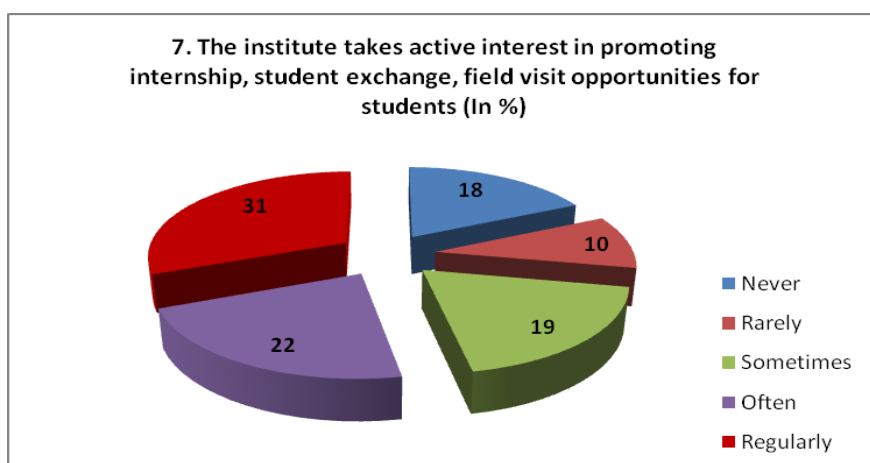

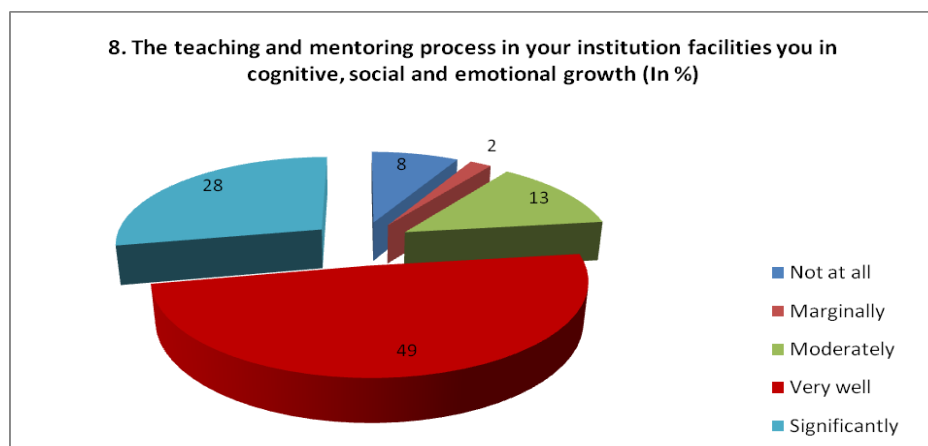
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.

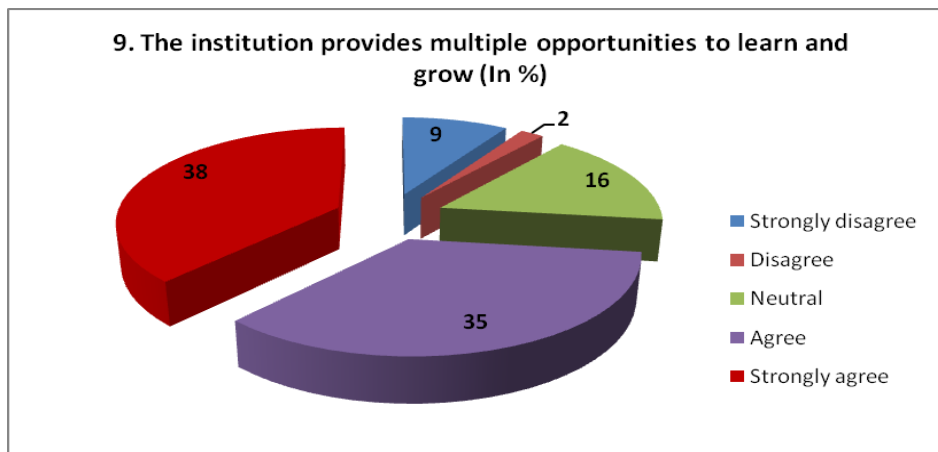

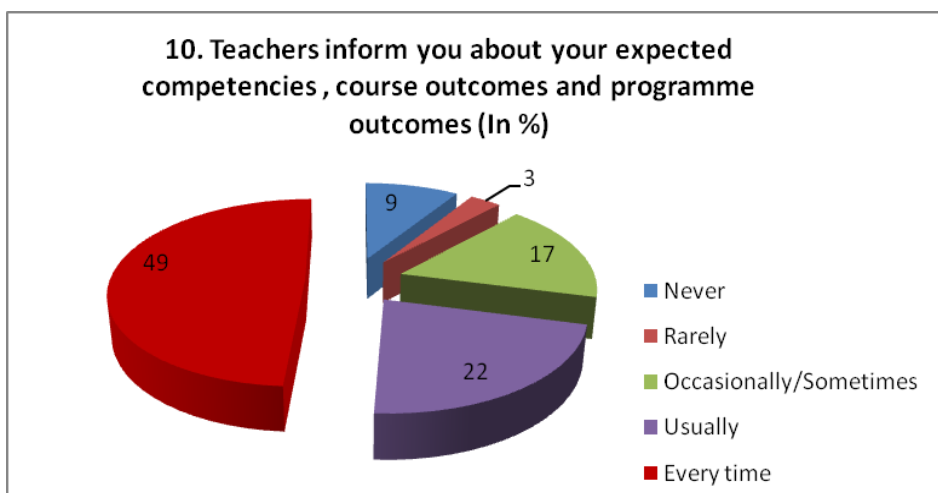

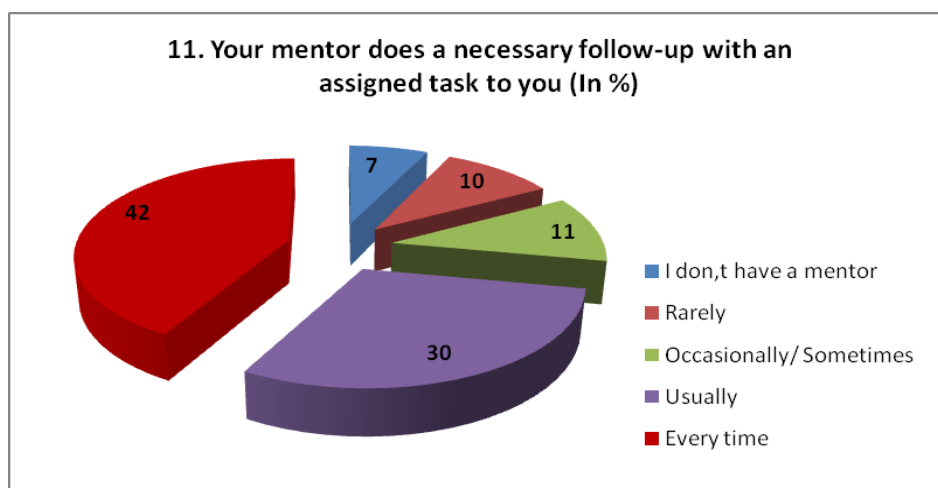

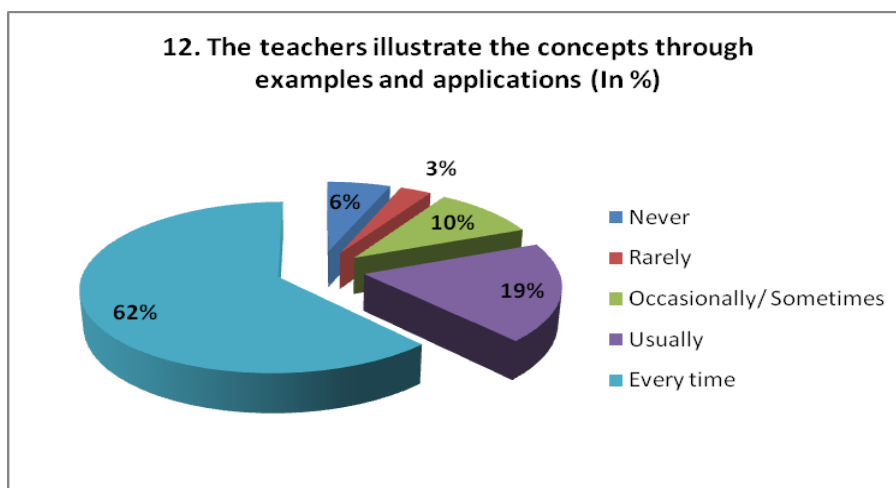
11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you

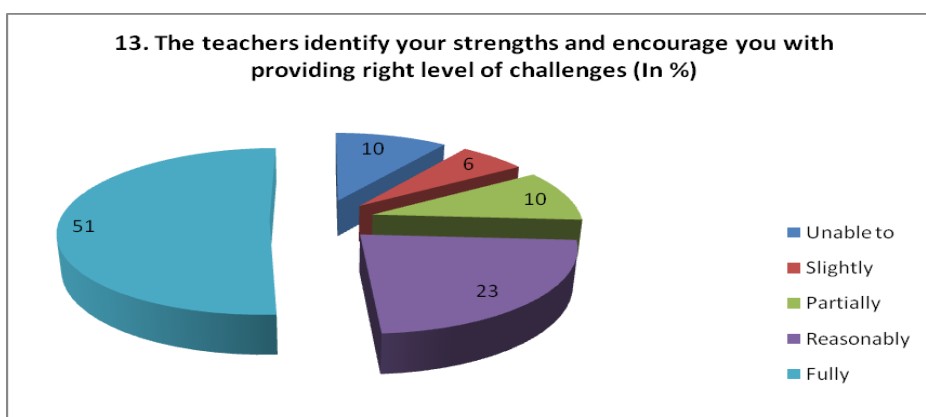
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

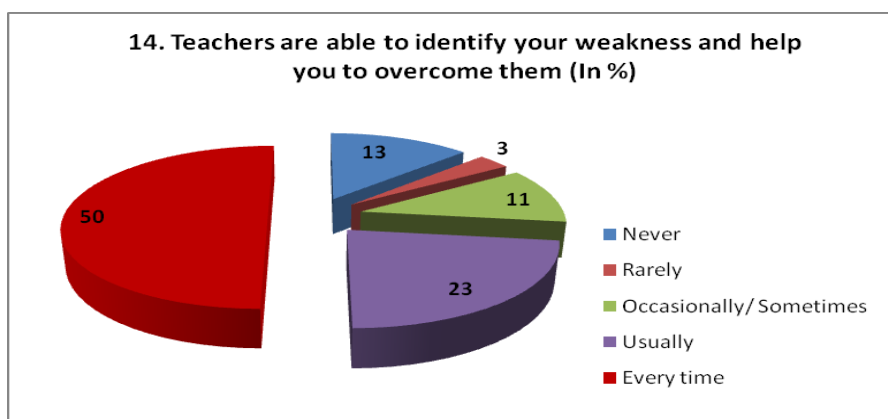

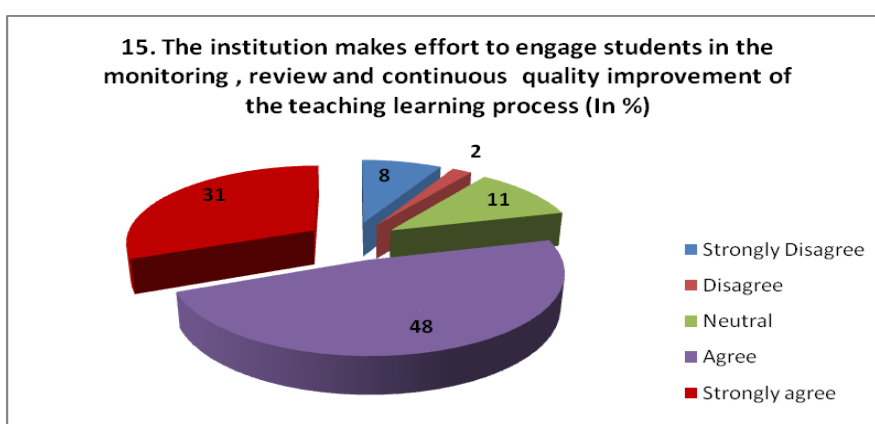

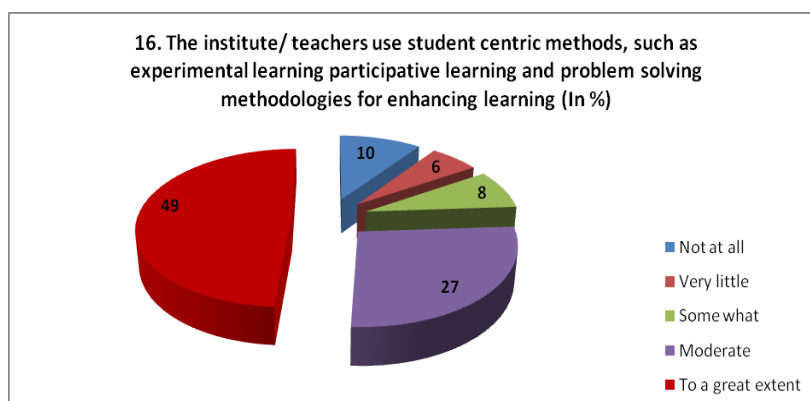

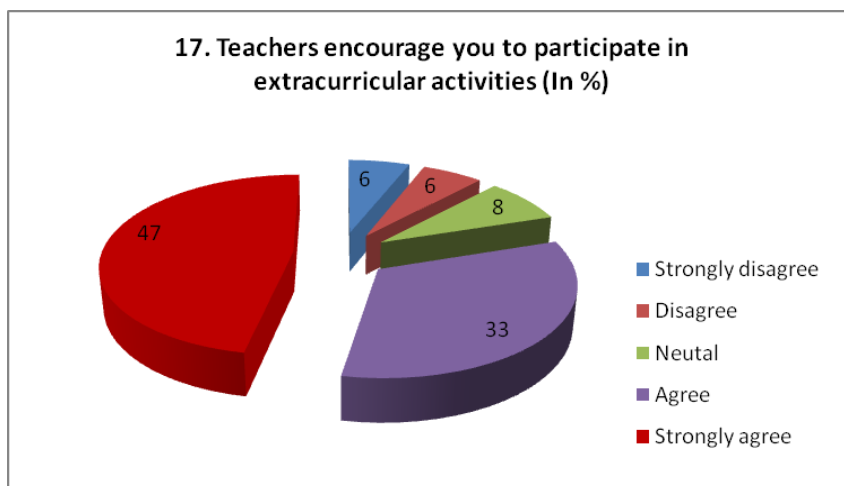

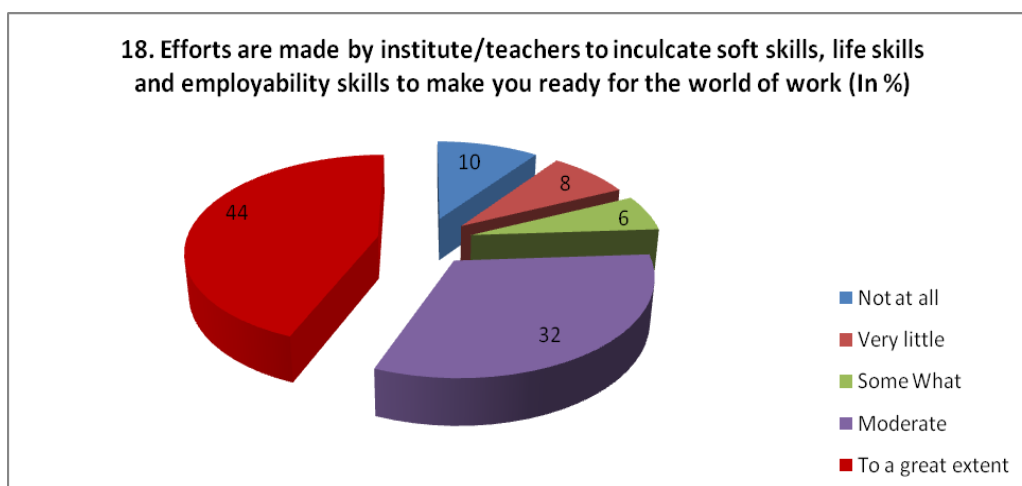
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities

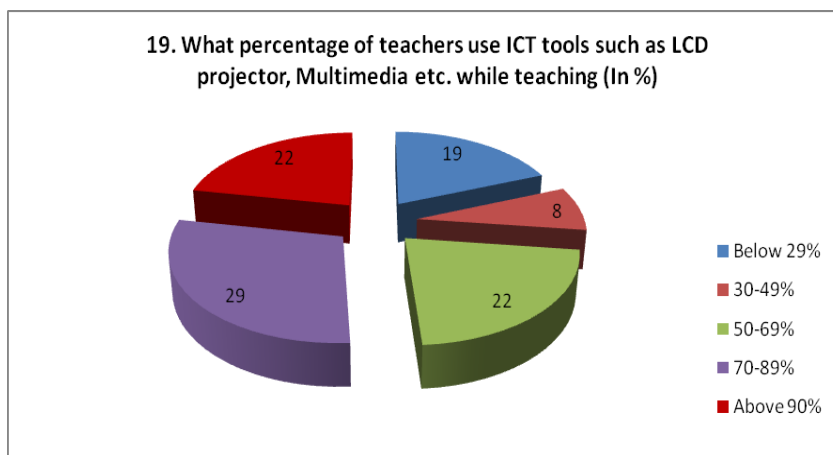

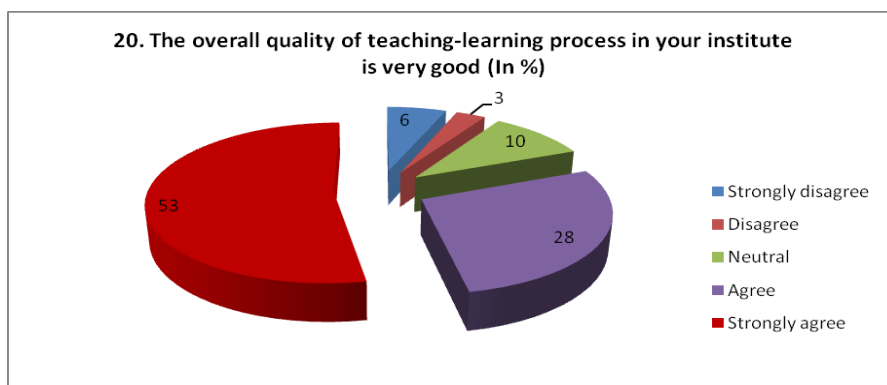
19. What percentage of teachers uses ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia etc. while teaching?

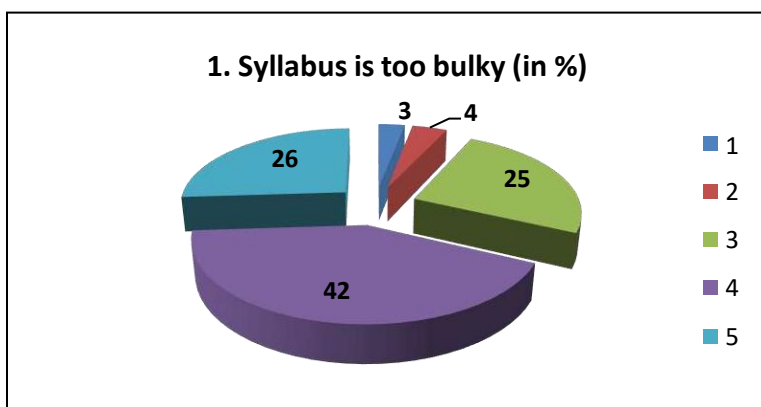
**Report of Feedback on Syllabus by Students

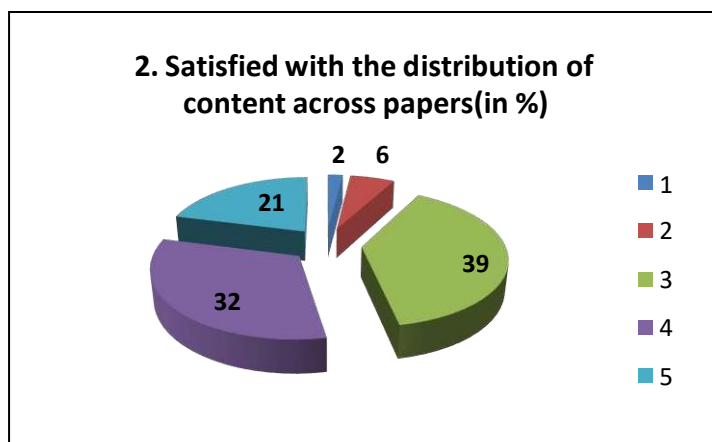

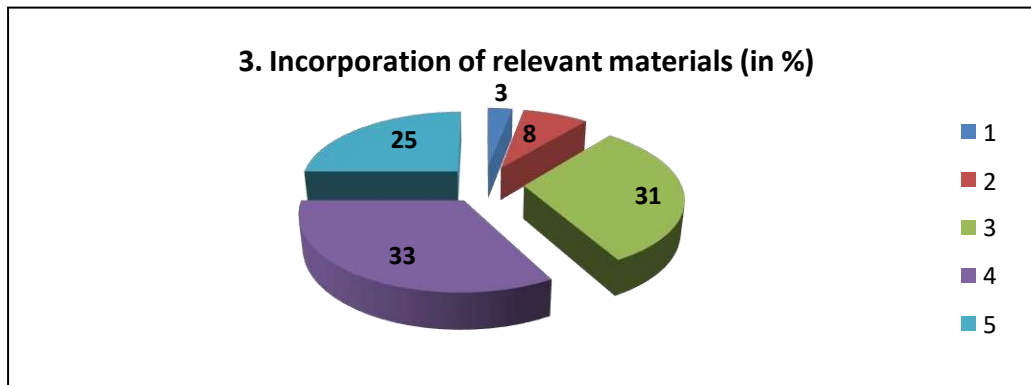
2. Satisfied with the distribution of content across papers

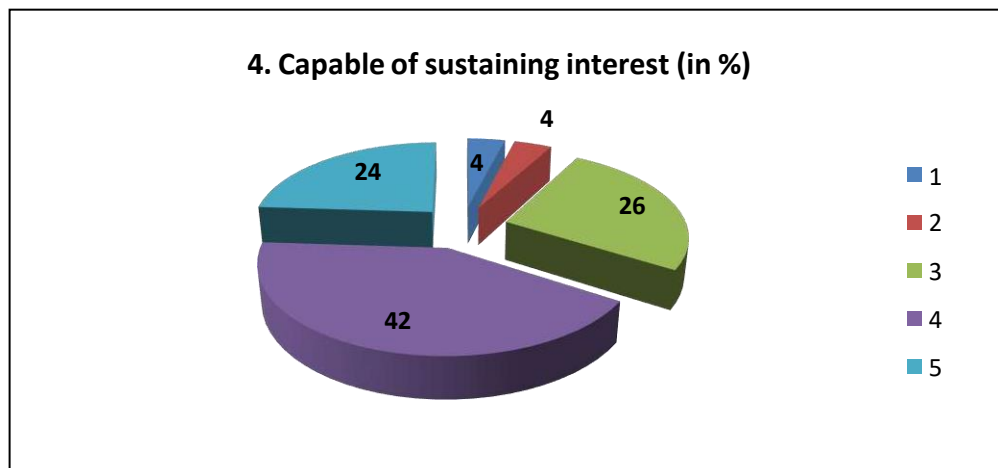

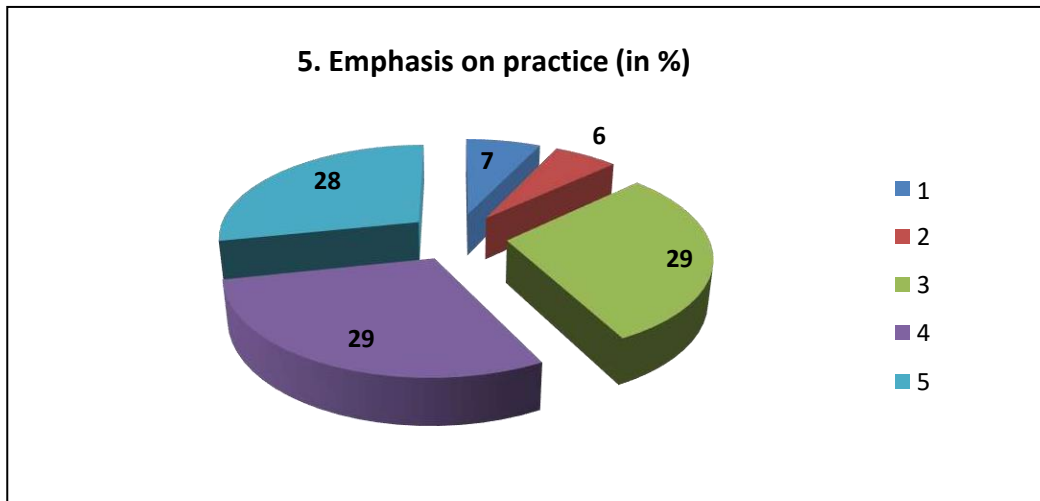

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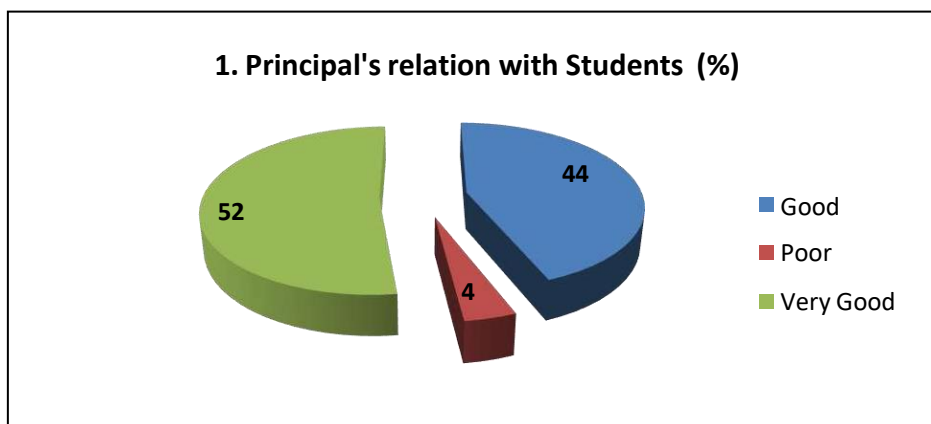
Report of Feedback on College Environment By Students

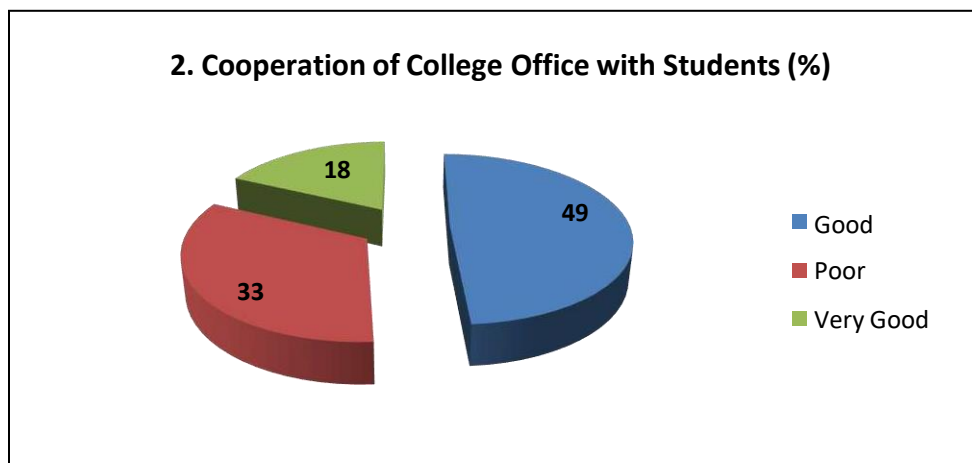

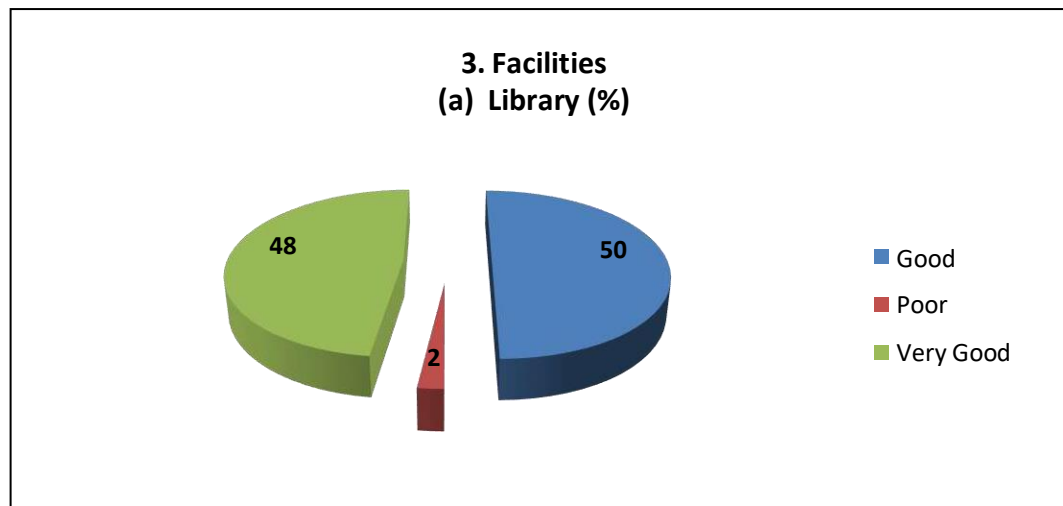

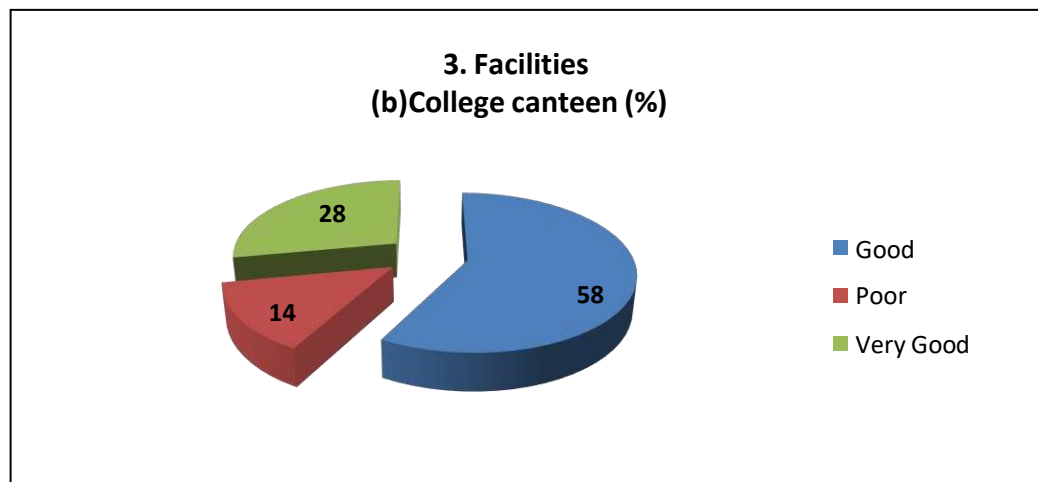

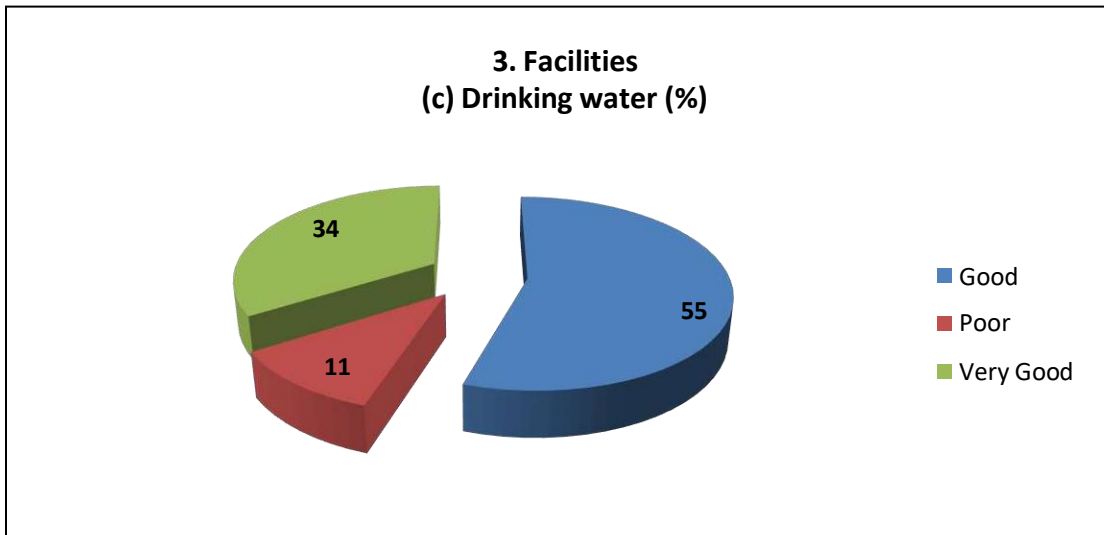

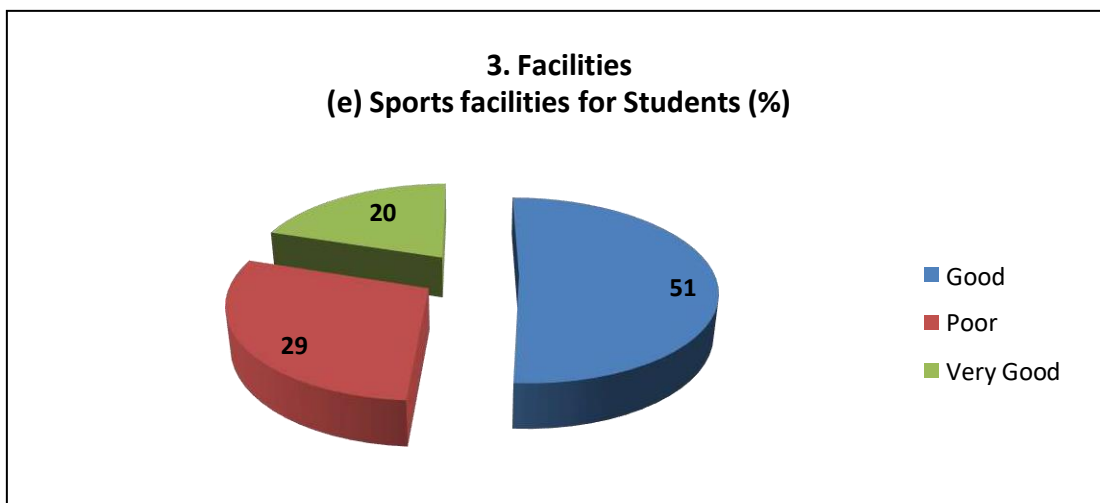

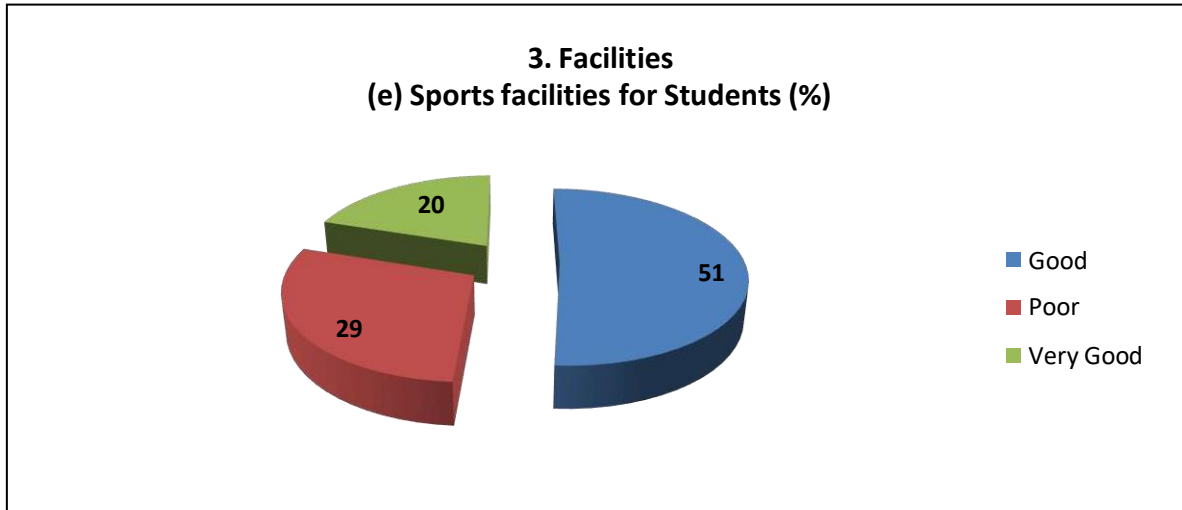

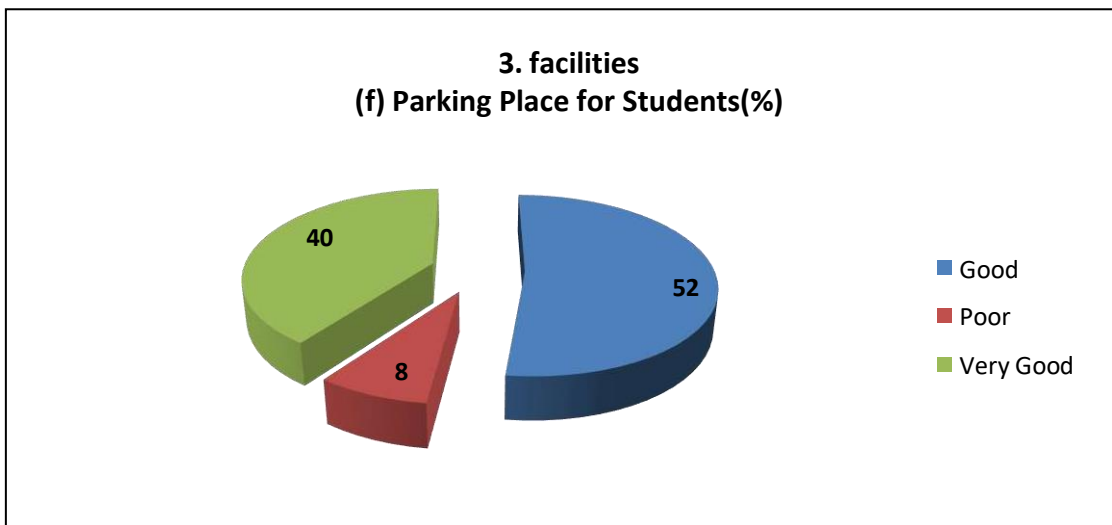

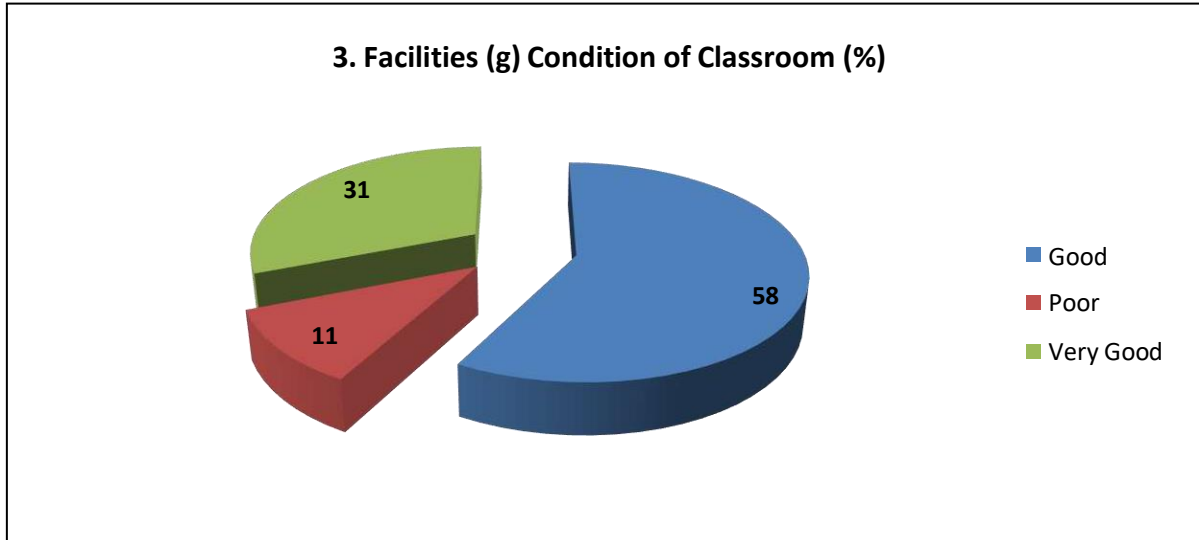

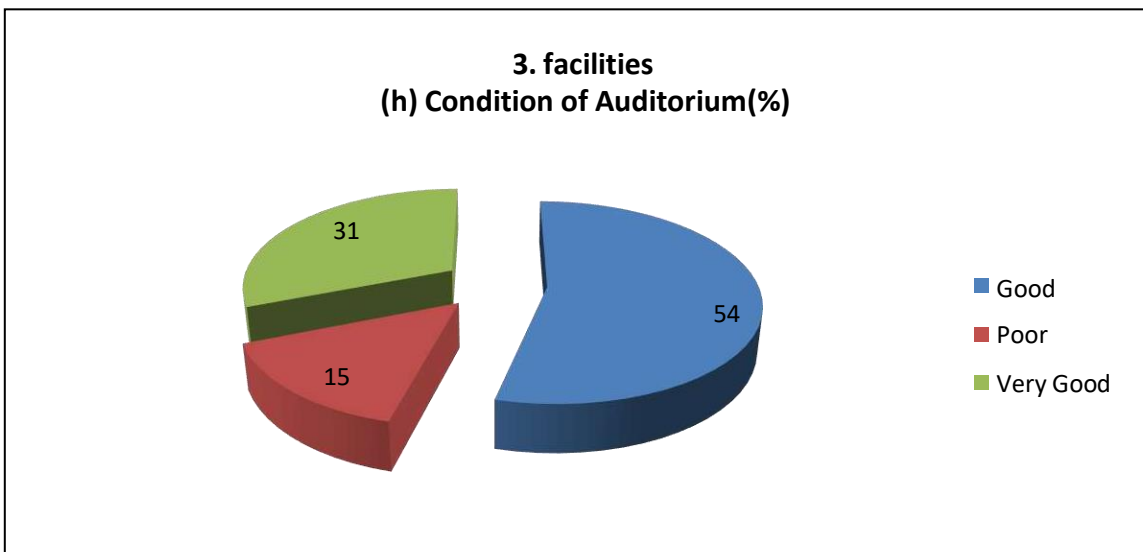

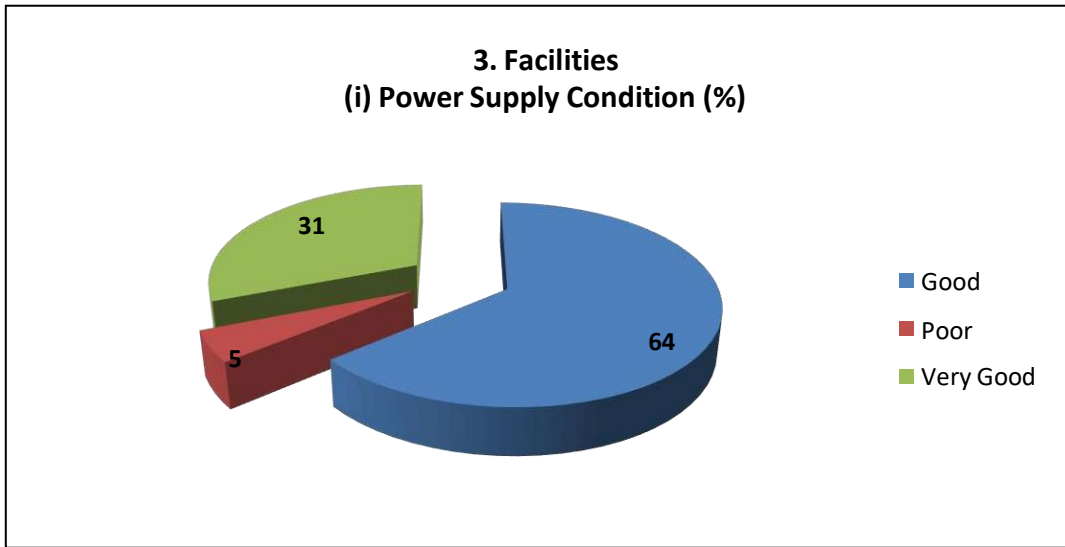

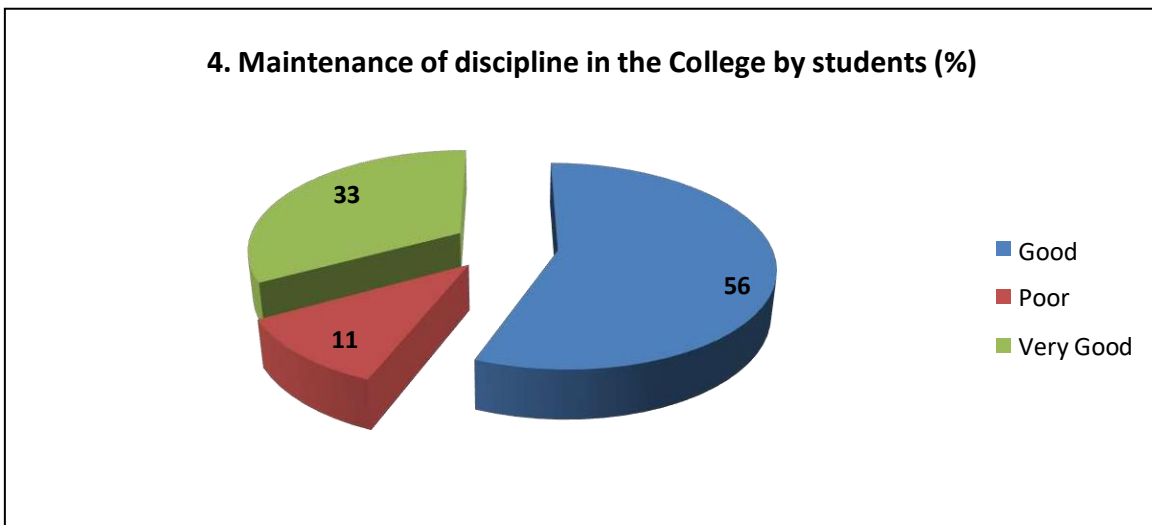

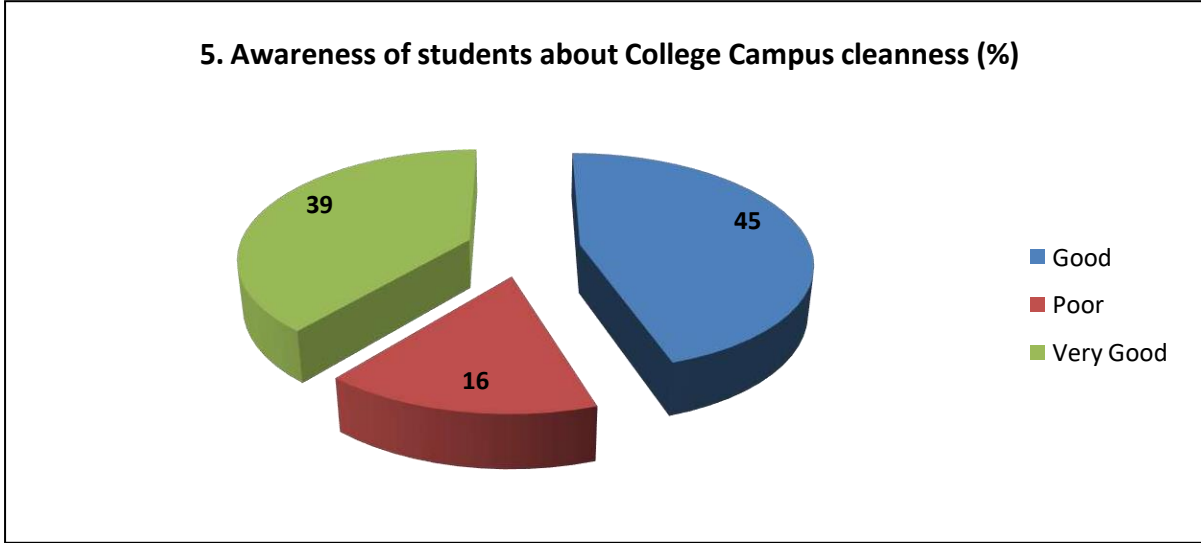

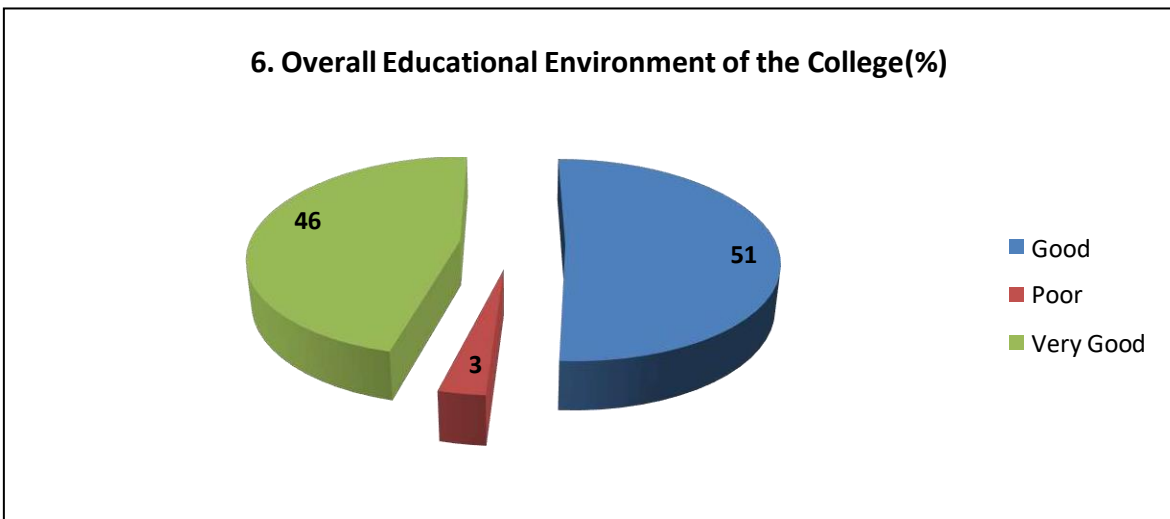
5. Awareness of students about College Campus cleanness

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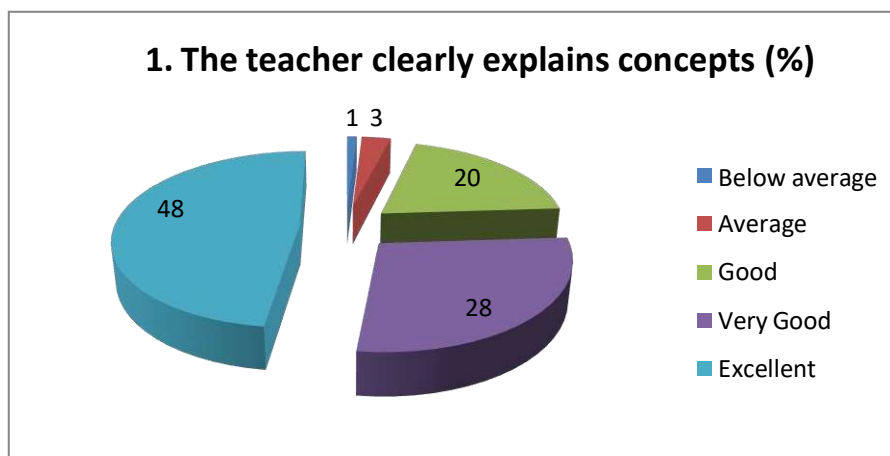
Report of the Feedback on Teachers by Students

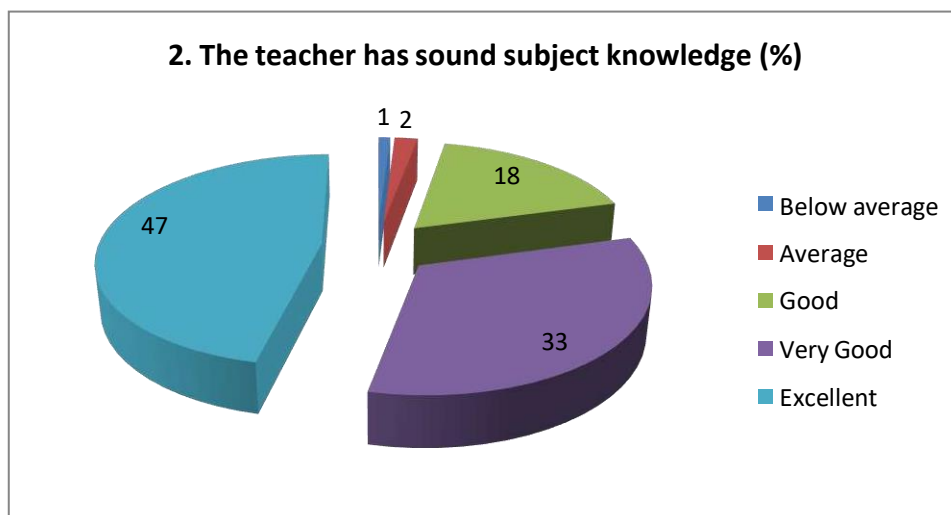

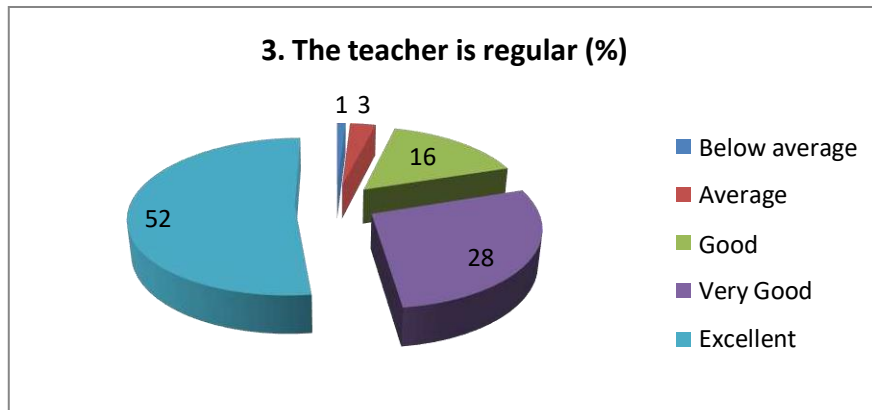

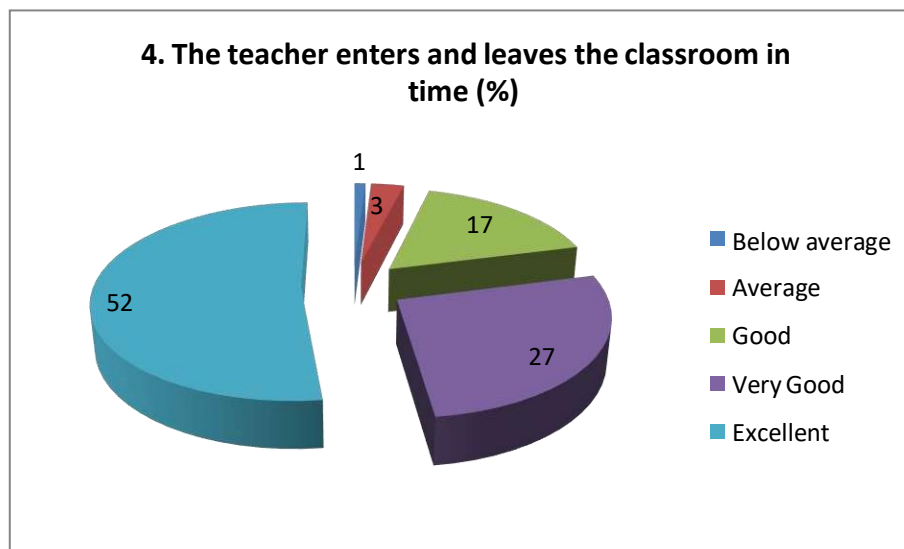

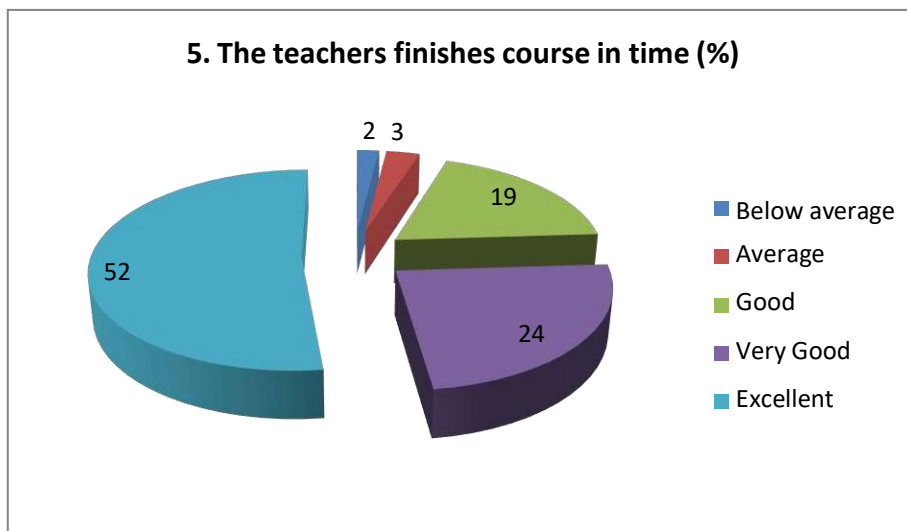

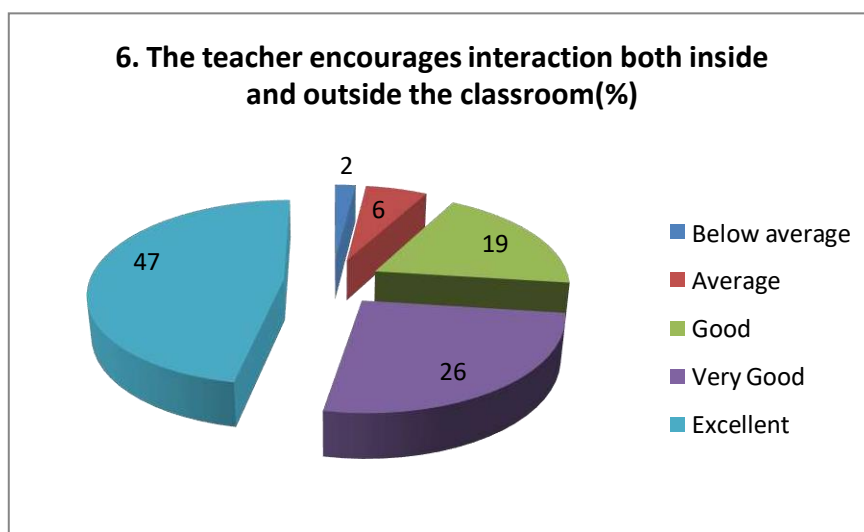

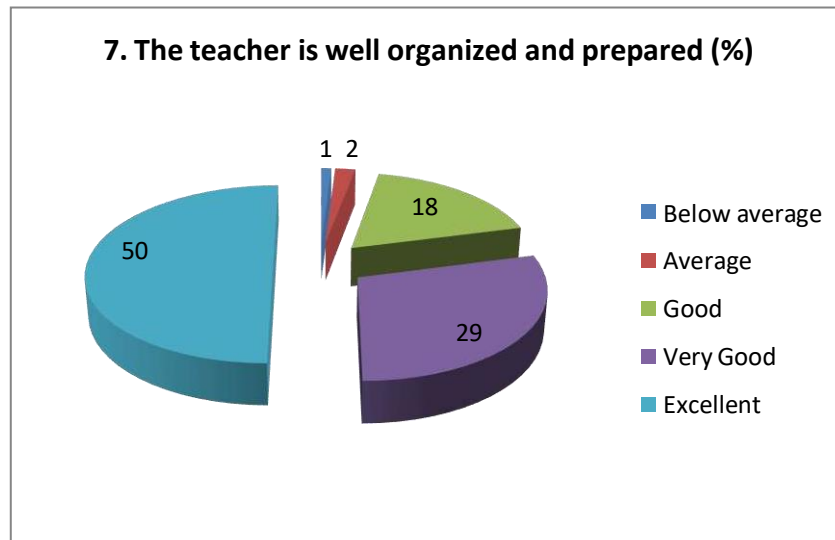

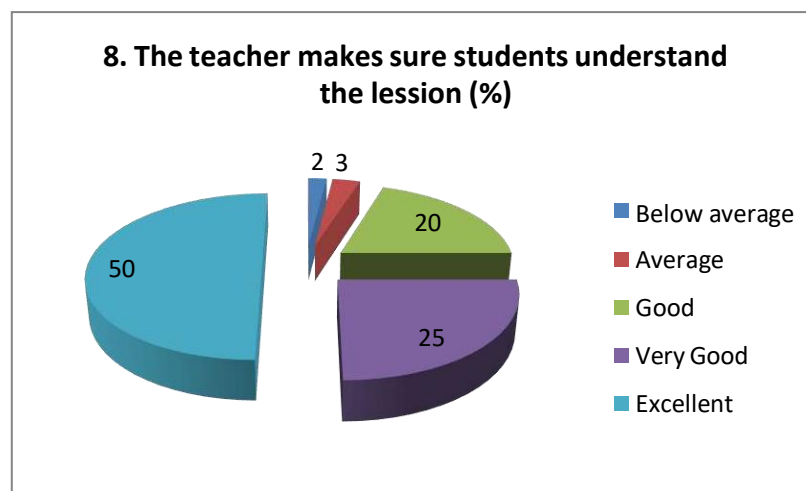

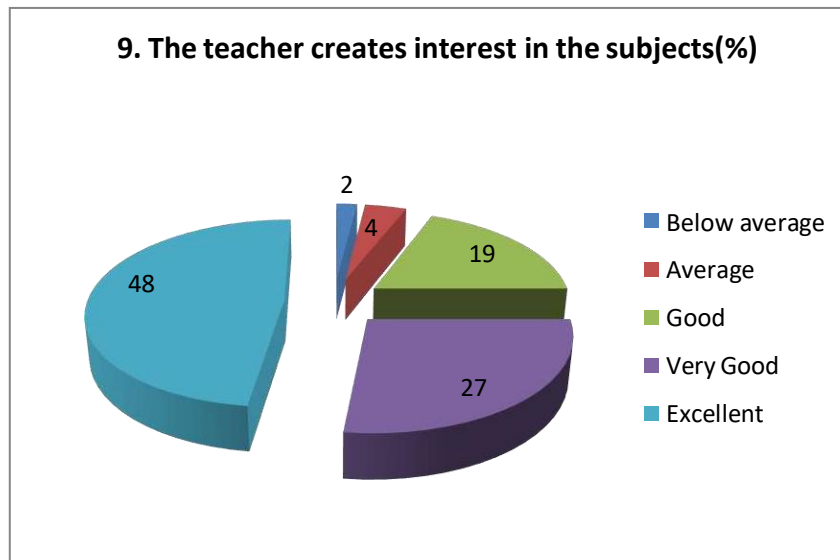

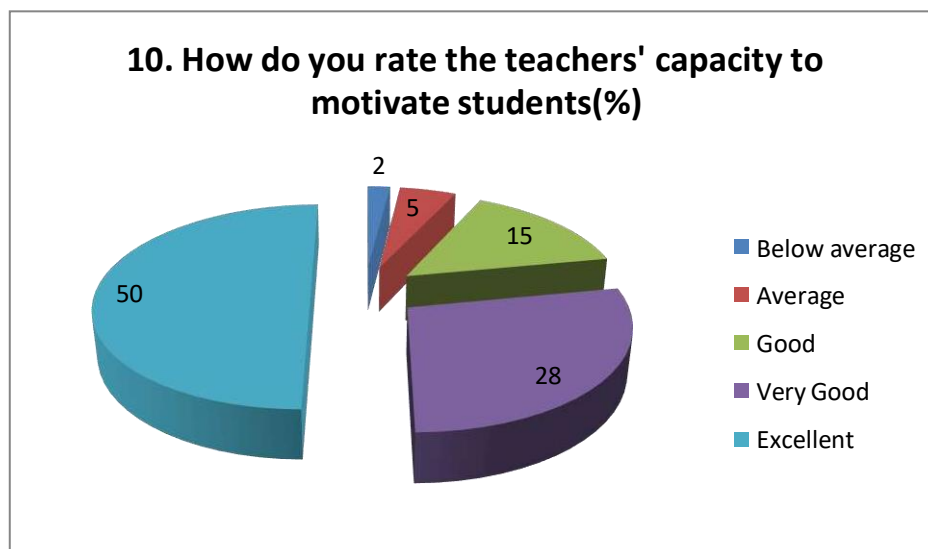

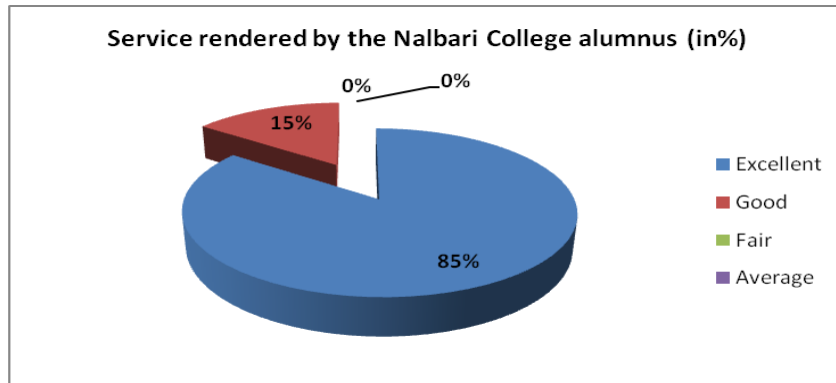
1. How far the service rendered by the Nalbari College alumnus has satisfied you as the employer?

0% Employers stated the service rendered by the alumnus of Nalbari College is average.



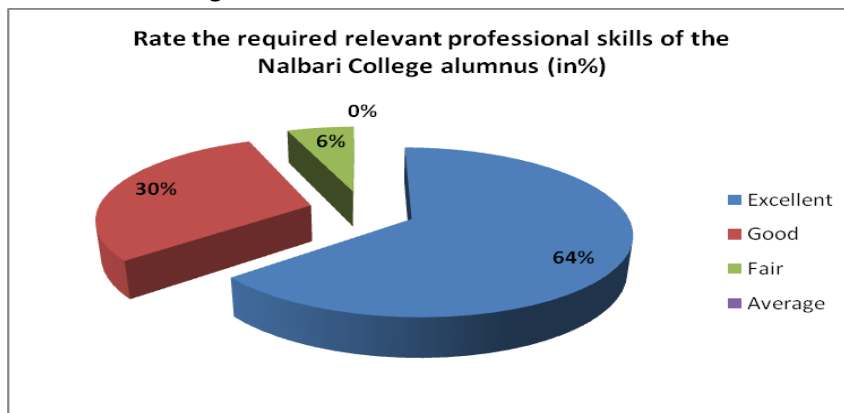
2. Rate the required relevant professional skills of the Nalbari College alumnus by employee.

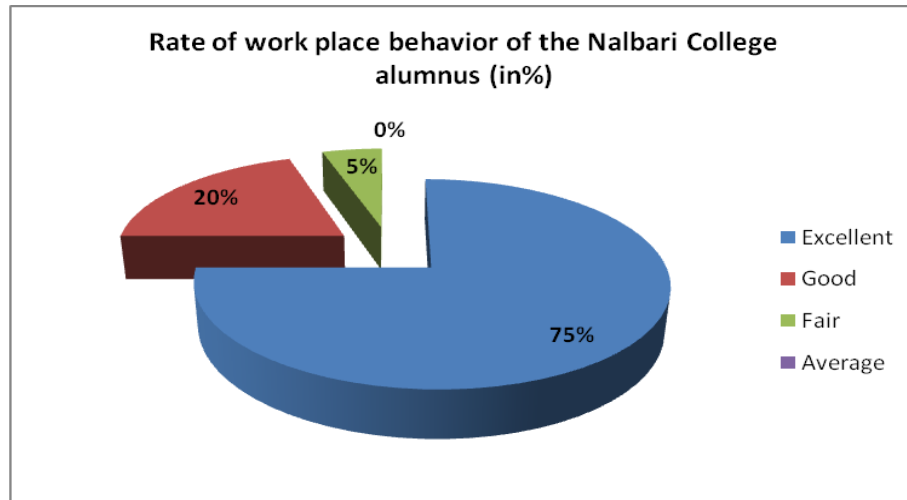

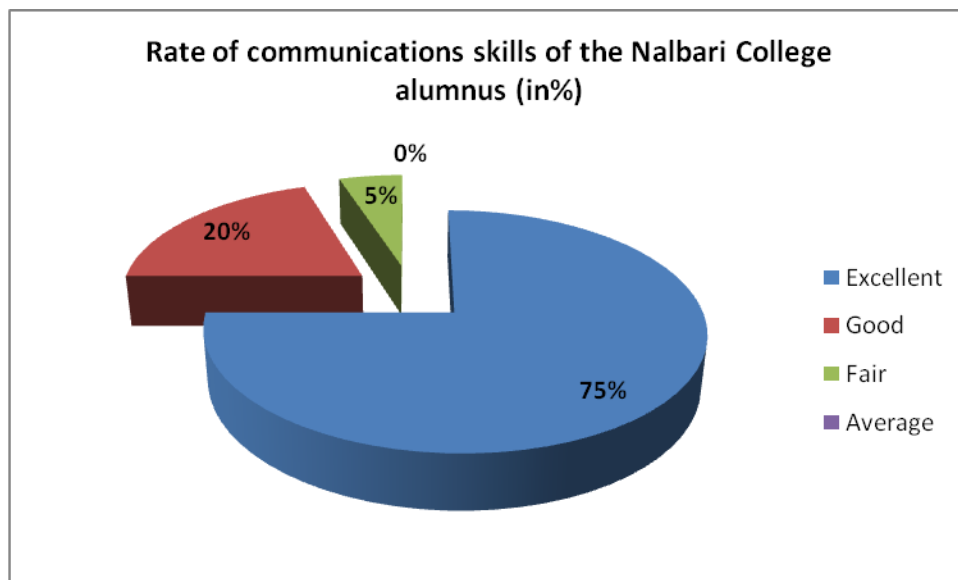
3. Rate the work place behavior of the Nalbari College alumnus employee

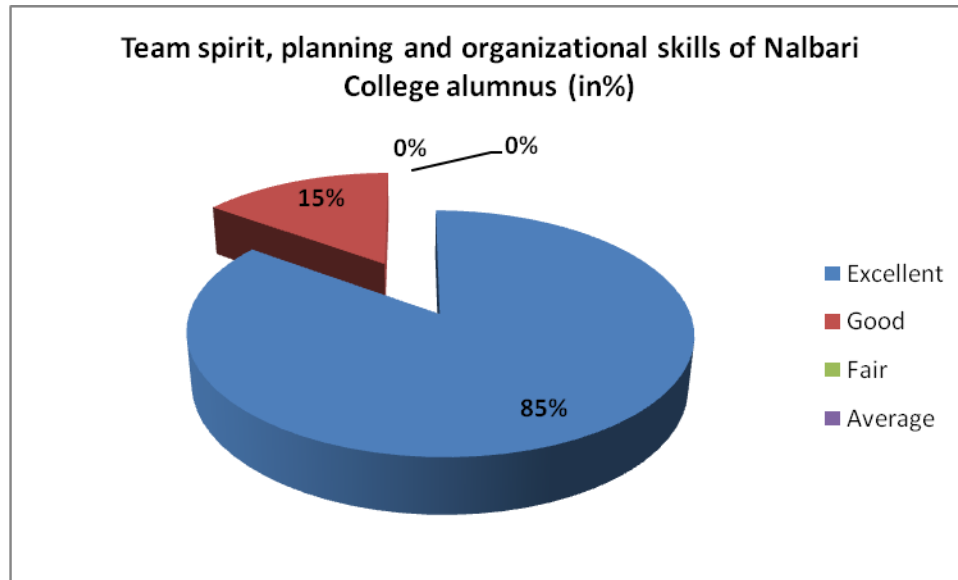

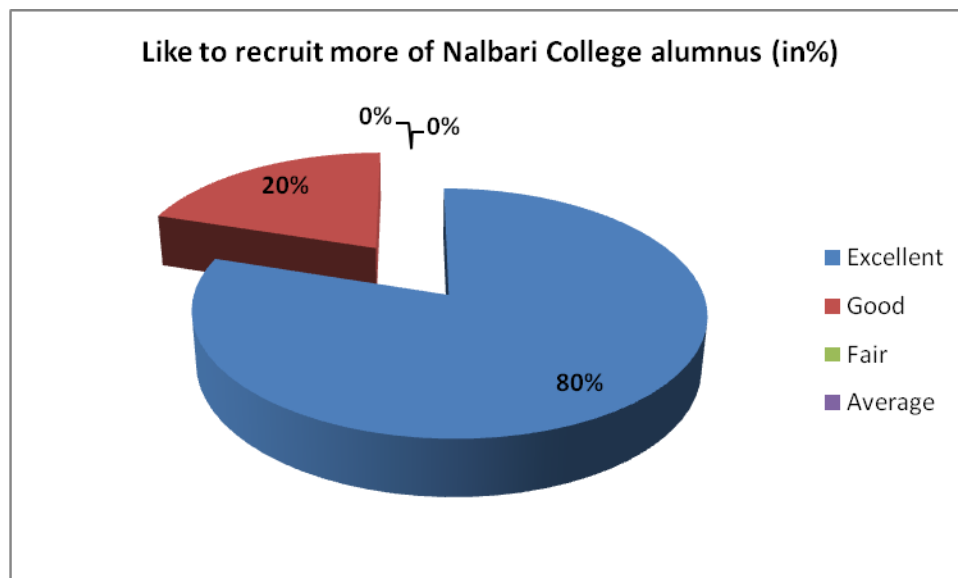

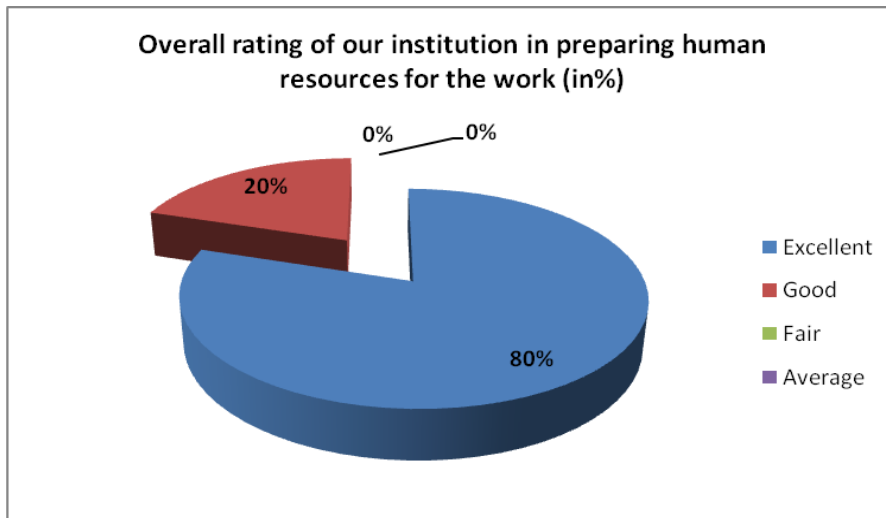
7. Is the education and skill received by the Nalbari College alumnus employee relevant for employee?

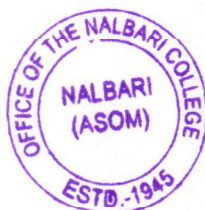
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
